Seashore Church adheres to a biblical model of faith in Jesus Christ, freedom, and liberty as laid down in our holy Scriptures. God does not violate a person's free will. So, while we affirm the benefits of modern medicine, we also affirm no medical procedure or treatment, including vaccinations, gene therapy, testing or screening to prove a person's health status, masking, or social distancing can be forced upon any individual against their will. A person is free to choose what is best for them and for their individual family. A person has authority over their own body.

The Religious Exemption in Title 7 of the Civil Rights Act is a federal law. Every person is bound and granted freedom by it. No person can change it. Neither the CDC, FDA or President can make a law to change it. No emergency situation can suspend the freedom it grants people. No health orders, policies, directives, proclamations, strategies, resolutions, rules or regulations are valid or lawful if they violate a person's individual rights. No one can be coerced, influenced, intimidated or forced to do something that is in conflict with their sincerely held religious beliefs. The law prohibits harassment, retaliation, threatening, and any other actions that violate or prohibit a person from living according to their sincerely held religious beliefs.

The Religious Exemption does not require a person belong to a particular church or faith, nor are they required to provide a letter from a religious leader to prove their religious faith. The Religious Exemption protects every person's God-given right to freely express their religious belief. To reject a person's religious exemption is itself against the law and an act of religious discrimination. Religious exemptions are required by law to be accommodated.
